Note: The historic Wells Fargo Bank Building is on the NW corner of Shattuck Avenue and Center Street. It is a distinctive, 12-story building with reddish-brown bricks and white stone. Take the elevator to the 10th floor and enter our main office through the second right-hand door to check in with our receptionist.

DRIVING:

From I-880 (most common route):

(Going toward Sacramento: Pass Oakland and Emeryville; the Bay Bridge is on your left as you approach Berkeley. From Sacramento, the Bay Bridge will be on your right)

Exit at University Avenue (and follow signs to the University of California)

- Continue East on University Avenue for approximately 2 miles to Shattuck Avenue
- Make a right on Shattuck Avenue. The Wells Fargo Bank Building is 2 blocks away, on the right side.

Parking

Most parking meters in downtown Berkeley have a one-hour time limit. Parking is strictly enforced throughout the City of Berkeley. For the old, familiar meters you need exact change (2 minutes = 5¢; 5 minutes = 10¢; 12 minutes = 25¢). In much of downtown the city has new “EZ pay stations,” which accept coins, credit, and debit cards. After paying in one of those meters, you need to place the receipt on your car dashboard. An outdoor metered parking lot with some 4-hour meters is located on Berkeley Way (1 block north of University Avenue), between Shattuck and Milvia (1 block west of Shattuck).

Two parking garages are nearby. After passing the Wells Fargo Bank building (Shattuck and Center), go another block and then turn right on Allston Way. Halfway down the block on the right is the entrance to a parking garage. If this parking structure is full, there is a city parking garage almost 1 block west of our building, with entrances on both Center and Addison (close to the Milvia Street corner).

Bay Area Rapid Transit Commuter Train Lines

(Serving San Francisco and Oakland airports, and San Mateo, San Francisco, Alameda, and Contra Costa counties)

Richmond train line, Downtown Berkeley Station

A system map indicating the route and stops of each train may be seen [here](#) and is located at each station and in each train car. The main entrance to the downtown Berkeley BART station is 1 block west of the Berkeley campus and across the street from (south of) HRA, at the intersection of Shattuck Avenue and Center Street.

Note about tickets: BART ticket machines accept nickels, dimes, quarters, \$1, \$5, \$10, and \$20 bills. You can also use a credit card in select machines at all stations. Each person needs a ticket, which is used to enter and to leave the station. The ticket machine will not give more than \$4.95 in change for any one transaction.

AC Transit (510) 839-2882

AC Transit buses serve commuters going to and from San Francisco and traveling throughout Alameda and western Contra Costa counties. A number of AC Transit bus lines stop at the corner of Shattuck and Center, 1 block from the western base of the UC Berkeley campus: 1 and 1R, 7, 9, 15, 18, 19, 51, 65, 67, 79, and F— which begins and ends at the San Francisco bus terminal. Taking BART from Oakland Airport

The Oakland Airport is approximately 15 miles from UC Berkeley.

- At the airport take the AirBART Shuttle to the Oakland Coliseum BART station (approximately 20 minutes from boarding).

AirBART operates daily, approximately every 10 minutes, until midnight. Service begins at 5 a.m. Monday through Saturday, and at 8 a.m. on Sundays and holidays. There is a single



shuttle stop for both terminals, conveniently located between Terminal 1 and 2 at the airport's third curbside. You need a \$3 BART ticket or \$3 in bills for the shuttle.

- Board a Richmond-bound BART train and exit at the Downtown Berkeley station (22 minutes from boarding).
- Using the main escalator (or elevator), exit the Berkeley station at Center Street.
- Continue across the street to the Wells Fargo Bank building (NW corner of Center and Shattuck): 2140 Shattuck Ave.

Notes about AirBART tickets and fares:

One-way regular fare is \$3.00; one-way fare for seniors (age 65+), children (age 11 and under) and disabled passengers with ID is \$1.00. Fares can be paid on-board bus with exact change only or with a \$3.00 or \$1.00 BART ticket (available for purchase at the Coliseum station). *NOTE: Bus ticket machines do not make change.*
